May the people of this land have eyes to see the inequity laid bare as this virus decimates Indigenous peoples across the country: food deserts, shelter deserts, healthcare deserts, water deserts, and more. It began with Papal bulls and has been perpetuated by lies and centuries of not honoring treaties.

When celebrating our rites and ceremonies, wearing our tribal clothing, speaking our first languages, we are told to go back where we came from. These misinformed souls do not know they are standing on our sacred ground, Mother Earth. She has nurtured, sheltered, and provided for us. We lived upon her respectfully, and now we grieve how our homeland has also suffered desecration.

Our God, we pray for our immigrant neighbors in detention centers, that they may be released back with their loved ones. Please keep them safe from COVID-19 and heal those who have contracted this illness in the close quarters and terrible conditions. We thank you for organizations and individuals in Seattle already fighting for immigrant rights, and we pray that your hand of justice be upon them. We also pray for those who will be affected by the DACA decision, that they can find the assistance they need to stay with their families. Finally, we ask you to protect immigrants who are victims of domestic violence. Especially during this time at home, we ask too that they can find the help they need to escape dangerous situations and find safety from both their abusers and ICE.

Our God, we pray for fierce protection over the 3.5 million of Your beloved children who are homeless in the richest nation on earth-- <u>where there are 18.5 million vacant homes</u>. For the willingness of Your church to serve the poor in boldness in this moment of profound crisis-- despite an earthly empire that would rather abandon Your unhoused children to fend for themselves during a plague with no running water, no heat, no restrooms, no access to healthcare, no shelter, no safety. For the humility of Your church to once again trust the poor, accept the authority of the poor, and nurture the leadership of the poor as we did back in the church of Acts 2.

Our God, we pray for those in African-American, Caribbean, and of African descent communities who have a higher risk of contracting and dying from COVID-19 due to systemic institutional challenges. May they know you are with them, and many others like them, as they lead careers and work in essential, critical industries that are outside the home, those who navigate inconsistent access to health care due to being underinsured, those who manage underlying medical conditions that leave them more susceptible to COVID-19, and those who live in residences where it may be challenging to socially distance – due to densely populated neighborhood living that's the result of historical redlining policies.

May they know you are with them as they continue to care for and provide for their families, and as they continue to lead rich, vital lives within their communities.

Our God, we pray for people of Asian descent who have been made to feel like they are not welcome in this country, their home, and we speak out against the violence, hatred, and xenophobia that has only increased because of COVID19.

Our God, we especially pray for the Filipino health care community who are caring for the sick here while there is a shortage of care providers in their home country. May they know you are with them, and all others like them, who encounter hate in the workplace, are exploited for their labor, and dying at higher rates, as they are afraid to speak out for fear of losing their immigration status.

Our God we pray, For the deaths of countless healthcare workers, including the two Seattle ICU workers who have died in the past weeks, and essential workers due to lack of PPE and overexposure that could have been avoided.

For those who are suffering from COVID19, and those who are afraid to seek treatment for fear of contracting it. For those more susceptible to contracting COVID19.

For those who are anxious and depressed.

For those without communities of support.

For those who are lonely.

For those who have no one to check on them.
